Q1: How did you come up with the idea of Express?

Our idea came to be after we had observed a couple of 5B students who had brought up the idea of "cross-dressing" in their English project, projecting a similar agenda with the hope of bringing into light the gender constructs that are associated with clothing. Struck with the lightning of inspiration and hope for change, we wanted, as a student body, to spread this message on a larger-scale—with the intention of bringing this controversial issue on the table, paving way for other issues that have yet to be discussed in Glee Path

Q2: Do you have any specific aims/objectives/goals for Express? / What do you hope to achieve from this event?

Our "crossdressing" event was truly the one that brought us all together, and sparked this discussion to light. Clothing, although might at first glance be something so simple, is integral in our identity, the way we carry ourselves, and self-expression. We wanted to challenge the gender norms that are typically associated with clothing, and how harmful these norms and stereotypes are in the way we express and carry ourselves. And more importantly, we wanted to educate not only the student body but the entire school



on the repercussions that come with constricting ourselves with such stereotypes. In doing so, being able to create a safe space for students, teachers and staff alike to express themselves freely—starting with something as simple as the way we dress.

Q3: Why do you think it is important to have an event like this?

We won't deny that this event and the process behind making it happen is impactful. It changes the way the student body is able to voice out their opinions, especially when what we are voicing and working towards is something controversial. This event paves the way to widening the scope of what we are able to talk about and raise awareness about in our school, and to being able to start that discussion towards an issue that we care deeply about is significant in making that happen.

We are sure that it is difficult to come out and discuss this issue—in fact, some of us are also scared! Joining our future events is completely optional. The purpose of this is to create a safe space for individuals to discuss topics regarding gender expression, sexuality, and more, without feeling scrutinised and vulnerable to hate, and we hope to create that safe space for you to express yourself without feeling such. COLLABORATING TO BRING RISE TO ALARMING ISSUES: R&E




What is the R&E (Research and Enquiry) project about?

The R and E Community Project is a major activity for students complete in S.3 at Delia Memorial School (Glee Path). There will be an exhibition at the end of S.3 for them to showcase their research progress and results. Students are expected to participate in a sustained, self-directed inquiry within a global context.


